Dear Participants,

Welcome to Brown County Country Club (BC3). On behalf of the Brown County Disc Golf Club, we are excited to have you at the 2025 Brown County Fall Classic. This year's BC3 Fall Classic will feature two rounds of 21 holes. The layout for both rounds will consist of holes from the normal BC3 layout, a borrowed hole from the "State's" layout, a couple of holes from the epic "BroCo Challenge" (our summer event) combined with a couple safari holes which have become staples for the Fall Classic.

New for 2025, I wanted to add another element of scoring separation and have incorporated hazard areas. The natural prairie grasses will be treated as hazard throughout the course. PDGA rule section 806.05 dictates the play for hazard which entails "A player whose disc is in a hazard receives one penalty throw. A hazard area has no impact on the location of the lie." Please take into consideration my intent with the utilization of the hazard area. The language used to describe the hazard includes phrases like "beyond the painted line". Using hole 14 as an example, a drive from the tee pad of hole 14 that lands in the fairway of hole 15 is still to be considered in the hazard area because it is "beyond the painted line".

The red course today measures 6975 feet and with a par 68. Players in the following divisions will be playing the red course: FP50, MA3, MA40, FA40, MA50, FA50, MA60, FA60, FA3, FA4, MJ18, FJ18, MA4

The blue course measures 8861 feet and the par is 73. The following divisions will be playing the Blue layout: MPO, FPO, MP40, FP40, MP50, MA1, FA1, MA2 FA2

This is a PDGA sanctioned event. All PDGA rules govern including the requirement for all players to keep score on the PDGA app or paper score card. This caddy book is only provided for player convenience. The holes that play on the normal BC3 layout, will maintain their hole number. There is also a Udisc layout for both red and blue Fall Classic that can also be a resource.

The Course

MA3, MA4, FA2, MA40, MA50 – Red Layout

MPO, MP40, FPO, FP40, MA1, MA2, FA1 – Blue Layout

The out-of-bounds and hazards are listed in this guide for convenience only. An attempt was made to ensure this guide aligns with the course rules as listed on the official PDGA score card. **If there is a discrepancy the OB listed on the PDGA scorecard shall dictate per PDGA rules.**

HAVE FUN!

1 The opening hole for the tournament plays on the normal BC3 layout for hole 1. OB is on or over the road and beyond the fence long. The basket is in the A position guarded by a slope on the left. Conservative tee shots landing to the right of the basket will require the player to determine if they are running at a very fast green or if a layup is in order. Red – 245' Blue- 327'

2 Plays on the normal layout for hole 2. OB is as marked on tee sign. This is the second hole on the course. Players must navigate a tight fairway and hope for a flat landing on their tee shot. Roll-a-ways can be costly with a deep ravine bordering the green. The basket is in the B position. Red – 192' Blue – 243'

3W The third hole has been a staple for the Indiana State Championship course for years. Players will utilize the tee pad for hole three but finish to the basket on the red wagon. The parking lot long is OB. Red – 357' Blue – 381'

******Regular hole 4 is not in play. Proceed to 5's tee pad.******



5 The fourth hole for the tournament utilizes the normal hole 5. This scorable par 3 features a slight downhill tee shot that players must navigate. The basket is in the A position. **Red – 229'**
Blue – 283'

6-9 The fifth hole in the layout will utilize the red tee pad of normal hole 6 and play to the basket of hole 9A which will be uphill and to the right of the pond as viewed from the tee pad. There is OB marked far right that typically does not come into play. A long precise drive will set up an opportunity to attack the green. Drives that favor the right side of the fairway will provide a difficult angle to the basket. Surrounded by water is OB. The basket is in in the A position of normal hole 9. **Red/Blue – 818'**

****Holes 6,7, 8, 9, and 10 are not utilized in this layout. Proceed to hole 11.****

11+ Modifications for hole 11 were introduced in 2024 for this tournament and will be in place this year. The blue tee for this tournament is a temporary one laid out with flags. Surrounded by water or pavement is OB. Players playing the red tees will utilize the course blue tee. The normal red tee pad is not utilized for the tournament. **Red – 233'** **Blue – 287'**

A Hole A is a temporary hole that has been utilized for other tournaments. There is an island green marked by paint and flags. Located in an exposed portion of the property, players must compensate for the wind if they want to land safe on the island. If the tee shot does not come to rest in-bounds, players must proceed to the MANDATORY drop zone, and a one penalty stroke is assessed. The island/OB is in play for the entirety of the hole. **Red - 215'** **Blue 270'**



12

The basket is in the B position. The tall grass on the right, marks the hazard zone the complete length of the hole. Discs completely in the zone are played as normal with a penalty stroke added. **Red – 239'** **Blue – 291'**

13

Hole 13 offers the player a couple of options to attack the basket. The tall grass marks the hazard area on all sides of the basket. The basket is in the A position. **Red – 234'** **Blue – 274'**

14

Hole 14 features out of bounds along the left side of the fairway and a mandatory tree on the right marked by a sign. Over the painted line near the tall grass along the right side of fairway marks the hazard area. The drop zone is to be utilized for shots that do not make the mandatory. The basket is in the LEFT or B position. **Red – 582'** **Blue – 935'**

15

The basket is in the A position on this seemingly straight-forward par three. The tall grass along the right side of the fairway marks the hazard area. The basket is in the A position. **Red – 276'** **Blue – 323'**

16

Players have several options on this hole, but must respect the tight fairway and steep ravine on the left. Unfortunate kicks to the left will test a players scrambling ability. The basket is in the B position. **Red – 188'** **Blue – 211'**

17

Trees frame the tight, downhill fairway. Be very careful descending the deep ravine should you kick left. The basket is in the B position. **Red – 243.'** **Blue – 273'**



18-19

This hole combines course holes 18 and 19 making the blue tee a par 5 and the red tee a par 4. Players must execute two precise and long shots to score on this hole. There is hazard marked on the right side of the fairway. **Red – 581'**
Blue – 849'

20

Hole 20 has been stretched for the 2025 Fall Classic. The basket is in an elevated stand and located beyond the normal B position. There is NOT painted hazard on this hole. **Red – 470'** **Blue – 588'**

21

Plays on the normal layout for hole 21 but with hazard. A hazard area on the left should be avoided to maintain par. The basket is in the A position. **Red – 267'** **Blue – 298'**

22

Shaded by the majestic catalpa tree sits the basket for hole 22. The demanding fairway is defined by hazard areas on both sides and long of the green. Plays on the normal layout for hole 22. The basket is in the A position. **Red – 315'** **Blue – 376'**

C

The 18th hole for the tournament is another temporary hole and a new addition to the Fall Classic layout. This hole has been utilized for the BroCo Challenge. **Red – 300'** **Blue – 350'**



23

The 19th hole for the tournament utilizes arguably the most iconic hole at BC3. This hole utilizes the normal layout for hole 23. The tall grass on the rightside of the fairway plays as a hazard. The basket is in the B position. Red – 516' Blue – 729'

24

Plays on the normal layout for hole 24. On or over the road on the right side is OB. The basket is in the A position. Red – 340' Blue – 525'

25

The final hole for the tournament is a temporary hole that brings you right behind the clubhouse. The tee is near the blue tee pad for hole 9. This uphill hole is guarded by trees and OB. On any structure or gravel is OB. Red – 244' Blue – 285'
