

Sand Creek Disc Golf Ground Rules

1. Water hazards and ball golf greens play as out of bounds (ob). Take a drop one meter in from the last point your disc crossed in bounds.
 2. The perimeter road and beyond plays as ob (except hole 17). Take a drop one meter in from the last point your disc crossed in bounds.
 3. A missed **single mando** results in a drop within three meters inside and parallel to the mando which was missed.
 4. A missed **double mando** results in a drop anywhere on the direct plane between the two mandos.
 5. Sand bunkers play as hazards. Play your disc from where it lands.
 6. All of the above results in a one stroke penalty.
 7. Casual relief may be taken from non-permanent standing water as well as the drainage holes.
