Caddy Book

Welcome to the 6th leg of the Belgian National Tour, held in park Koude Keuken in Bruges!

The brand new permanent 9-hole lay-out is adjusted and complemented with 5 temporary holes (hole 1 – 5) to make it into a diverse and challenging lay-out of 13 holes.

3 rounds will be played on the extended lay-out. Scoring will be done through PDGA. As usual, two scorekeepers are required minimally per round.

PDGA Live access code is **BNT6**

Junior Tees are not shown in the caddy book. They are marked by orange flags on the course. If the main tee is also the junior tee, the orange flags are on the main tee.

As this is a new course, other park users might not be aware of disc golf so please pay extra attention during play and use spotters any time you do not have full visibility.

Parking is available on **Zandstraat 284, 8200 Sint-Andries (Brugge)**, or the streets surrounding the park.

Meeting point and players meeting is held at the summer bar Jakk Bar on the south side of the park. Drinks and some snacks will be sold there from 1PM.

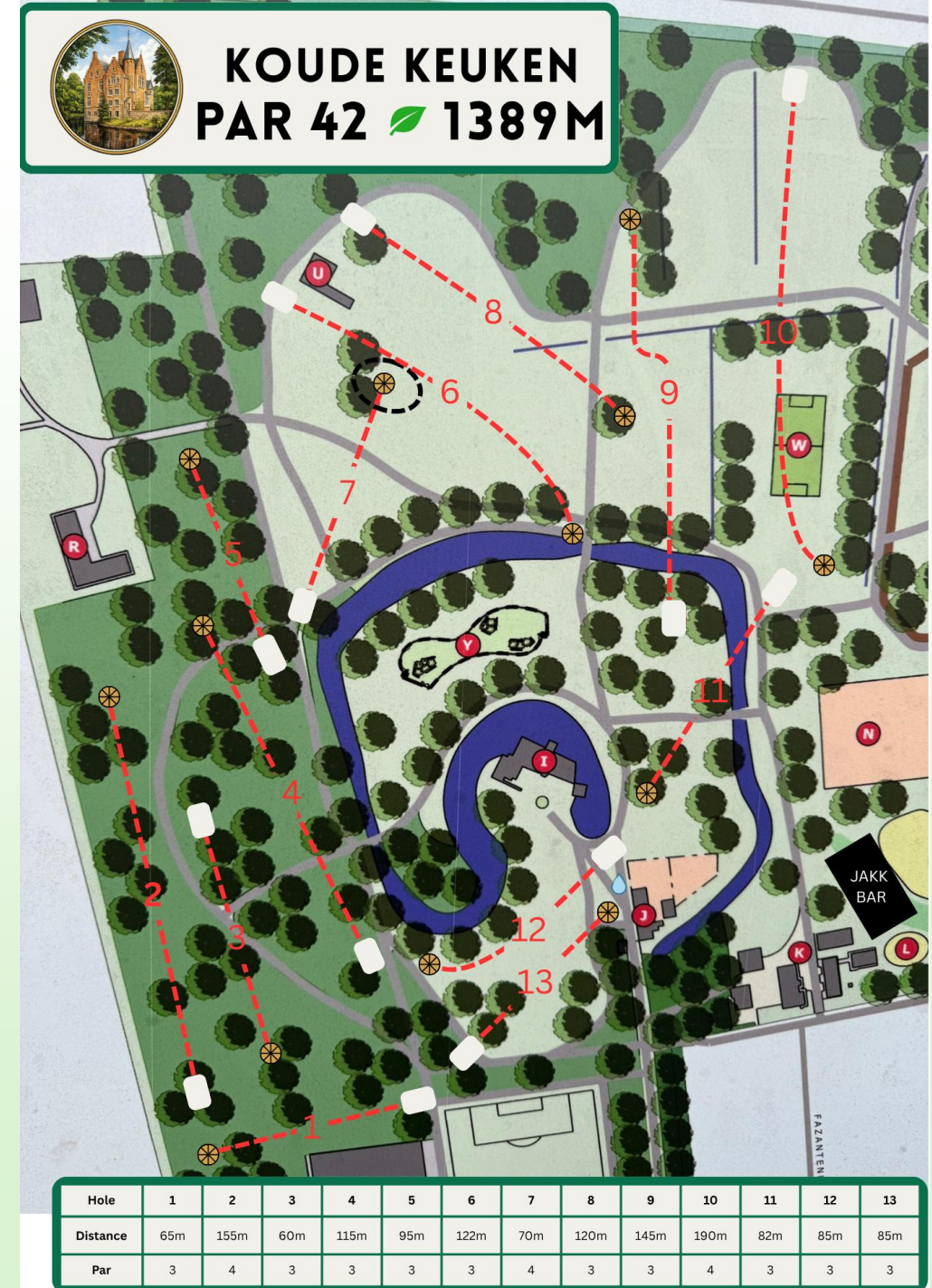

Course Map

Parking on the Zandstraat just besides the football pitch on the bottom of the map near hole 1

Free water available from the tap next to tee pad hole 12

Toilets available at Jakk Bar (once open)





ALERT!

Hot and dry weather causes beeches to shed healthy branches, often the old and heavy ones.

Be cautious especially on hole 1-5 where many green beeches can be found.

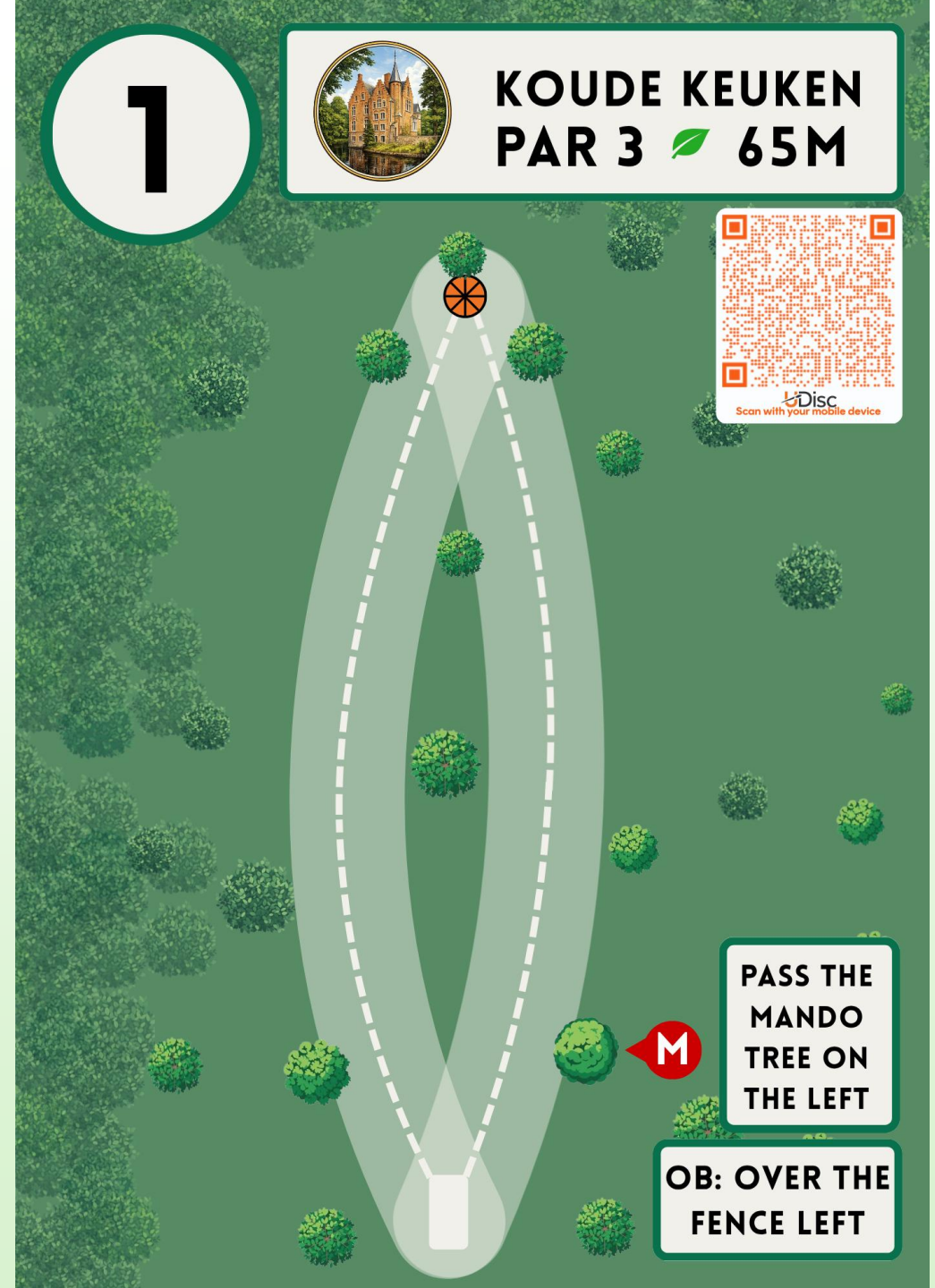
You can recognise beeches by their smooth bark (right), in comparison to the oaks (left) or chestnuts in the park.



Hole 1

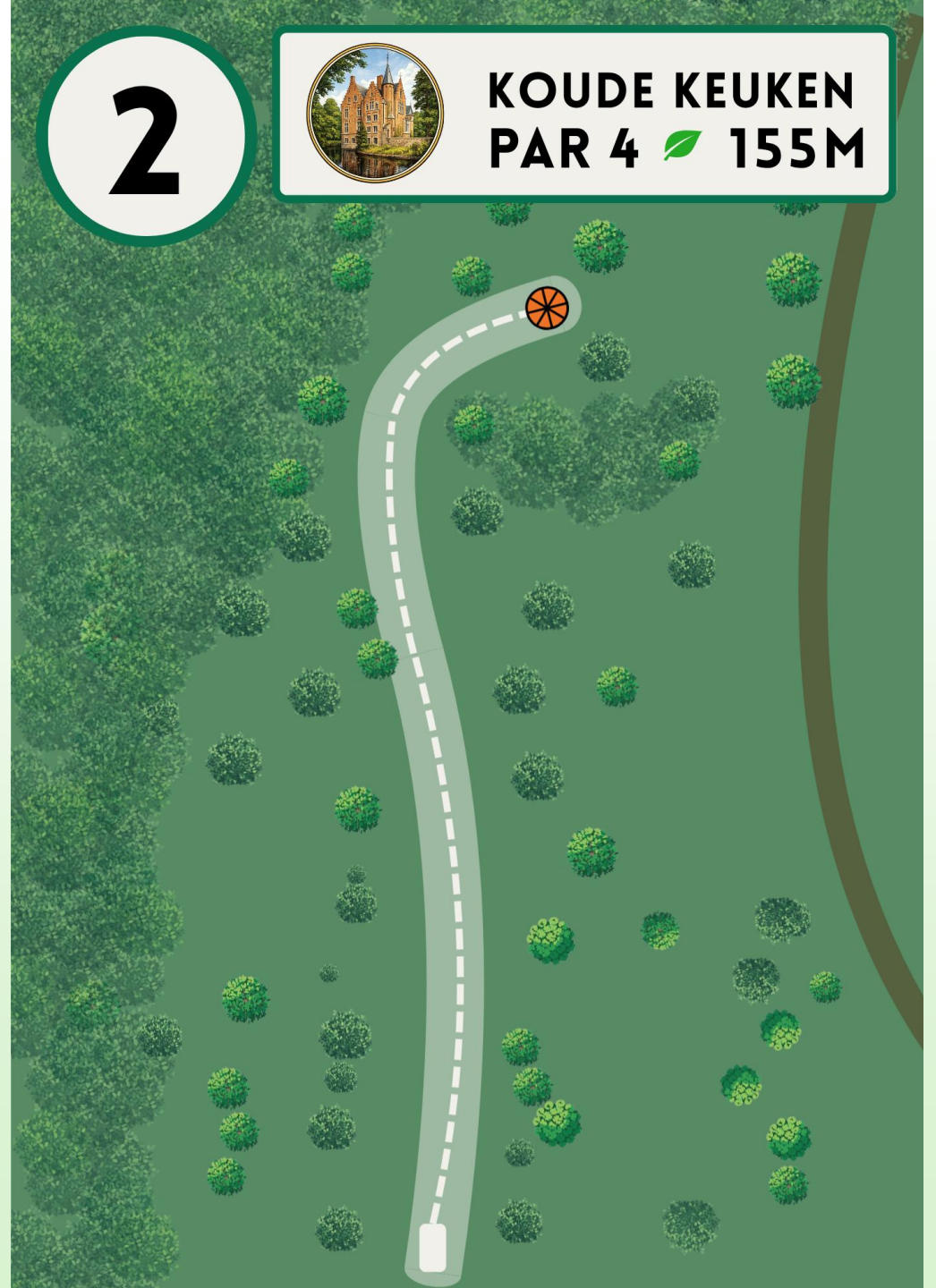
Mando on the first tree on the right. Need to pass it on the left. Re-tee if the mando is missed with a penalty stroke added.

OB over the property fence very long and very left, but should not be in play



Hole 2

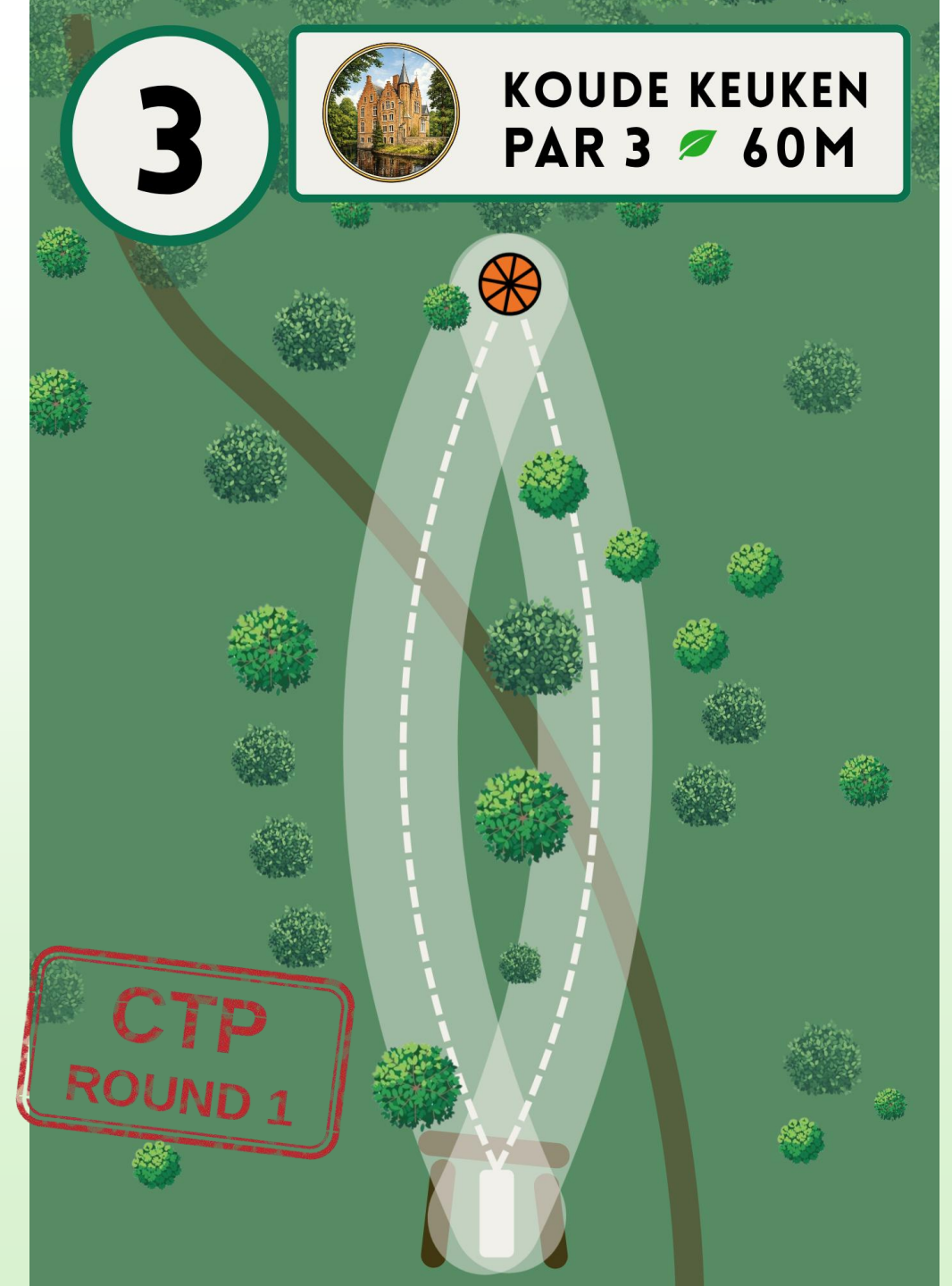
OB over the property fence left, through a lot of rough



Hole 3

Path is not OB

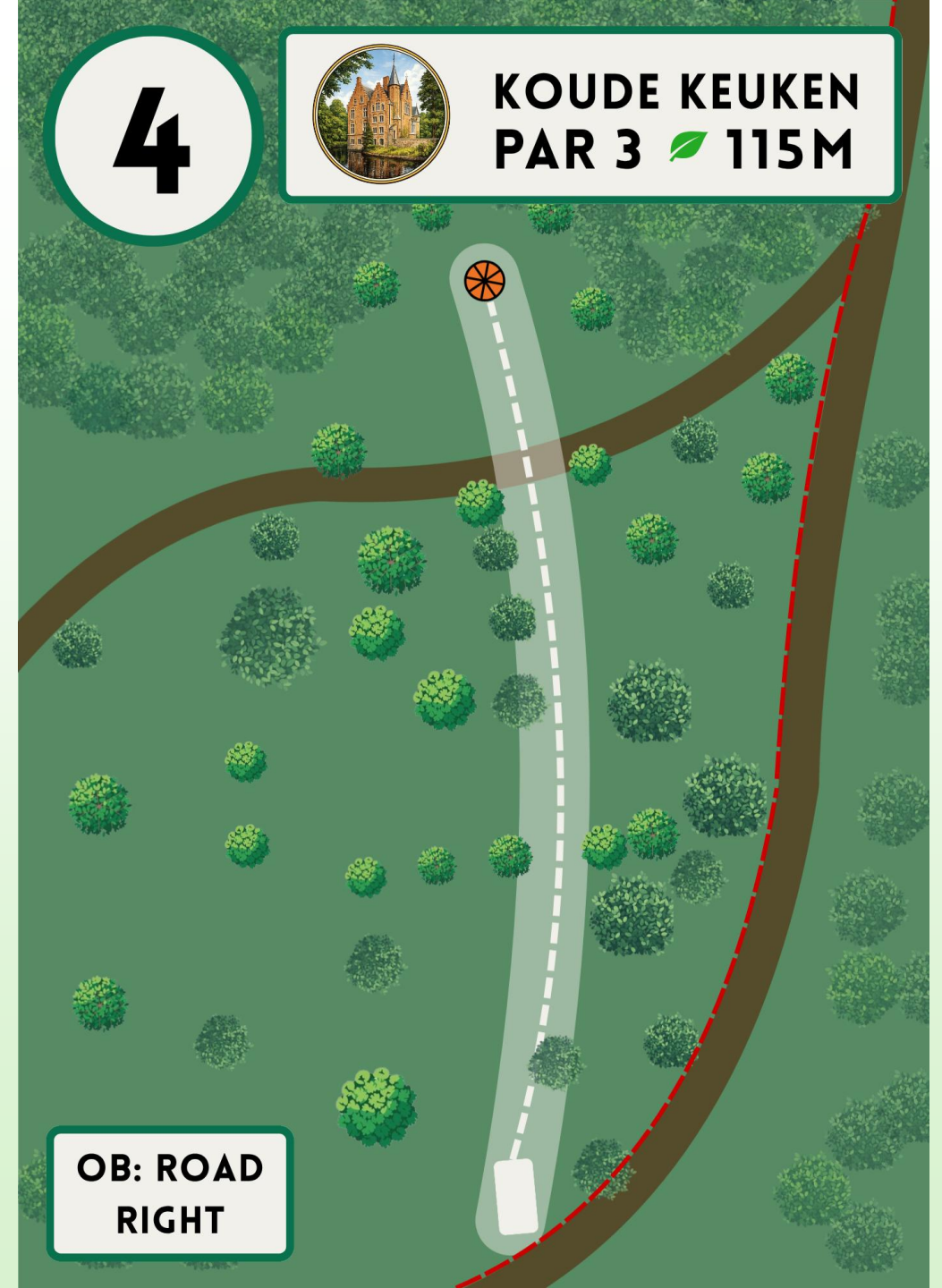
CTP Round 1!



Hole 4

Path on the right is OB

Path crossing the fairway is not OB



Hole 5

Path on the right and long is OB

Path crossing the fairway is not OB



Hole 6

Mando tree on the right side, pass it on the left.

Right side OB running along the island of hole 7

Archery gallery is OB

Left Side OB running from the gallery to the water

Water OB



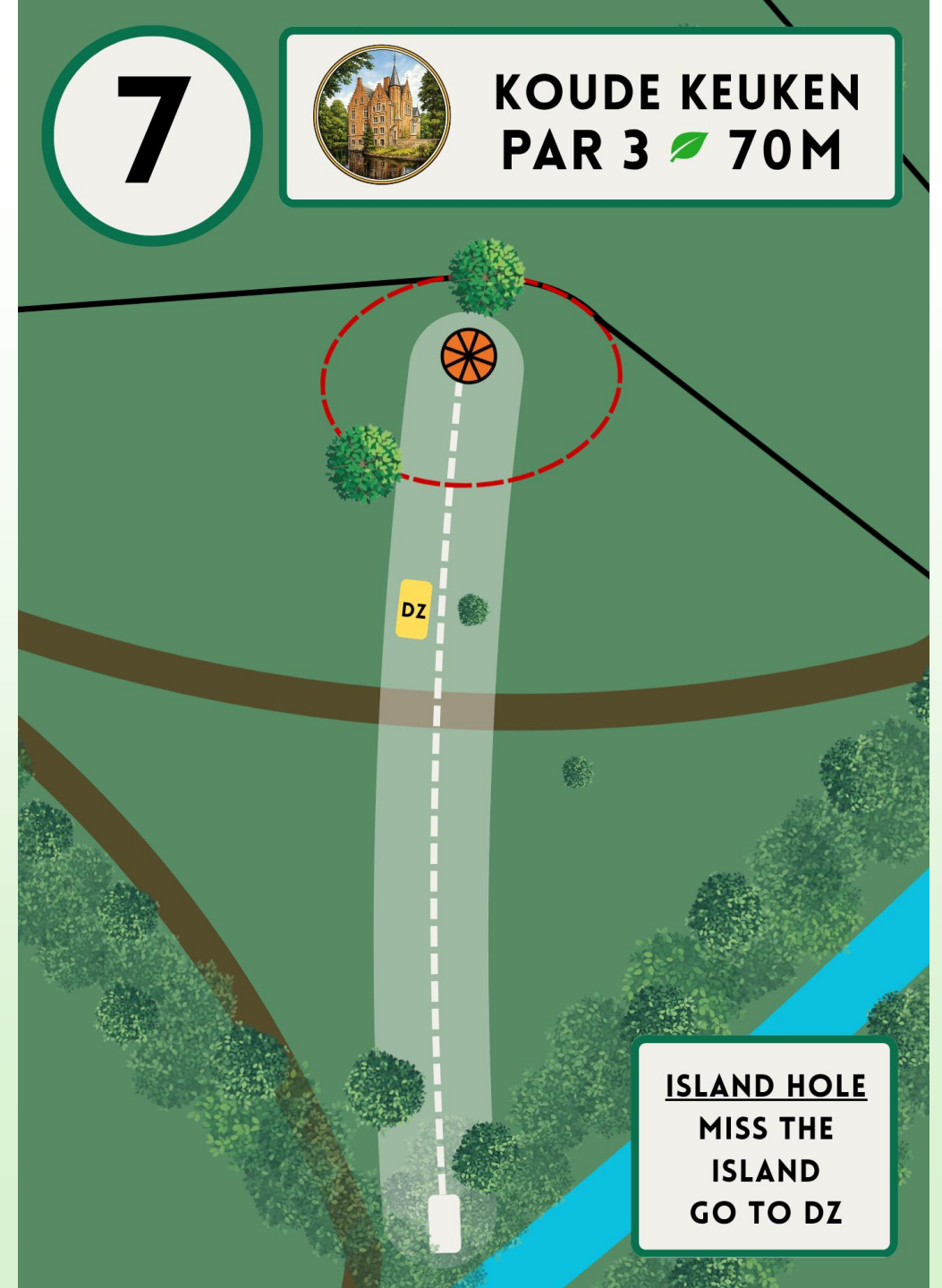
Hole 7

Island hole!

Miss the island on tee shot: go to drop zone

Miss the island on DZ shot: normal OB rules

Loop around hole 6 to walk to hole 8. Do not cross the fairway



Hole 8

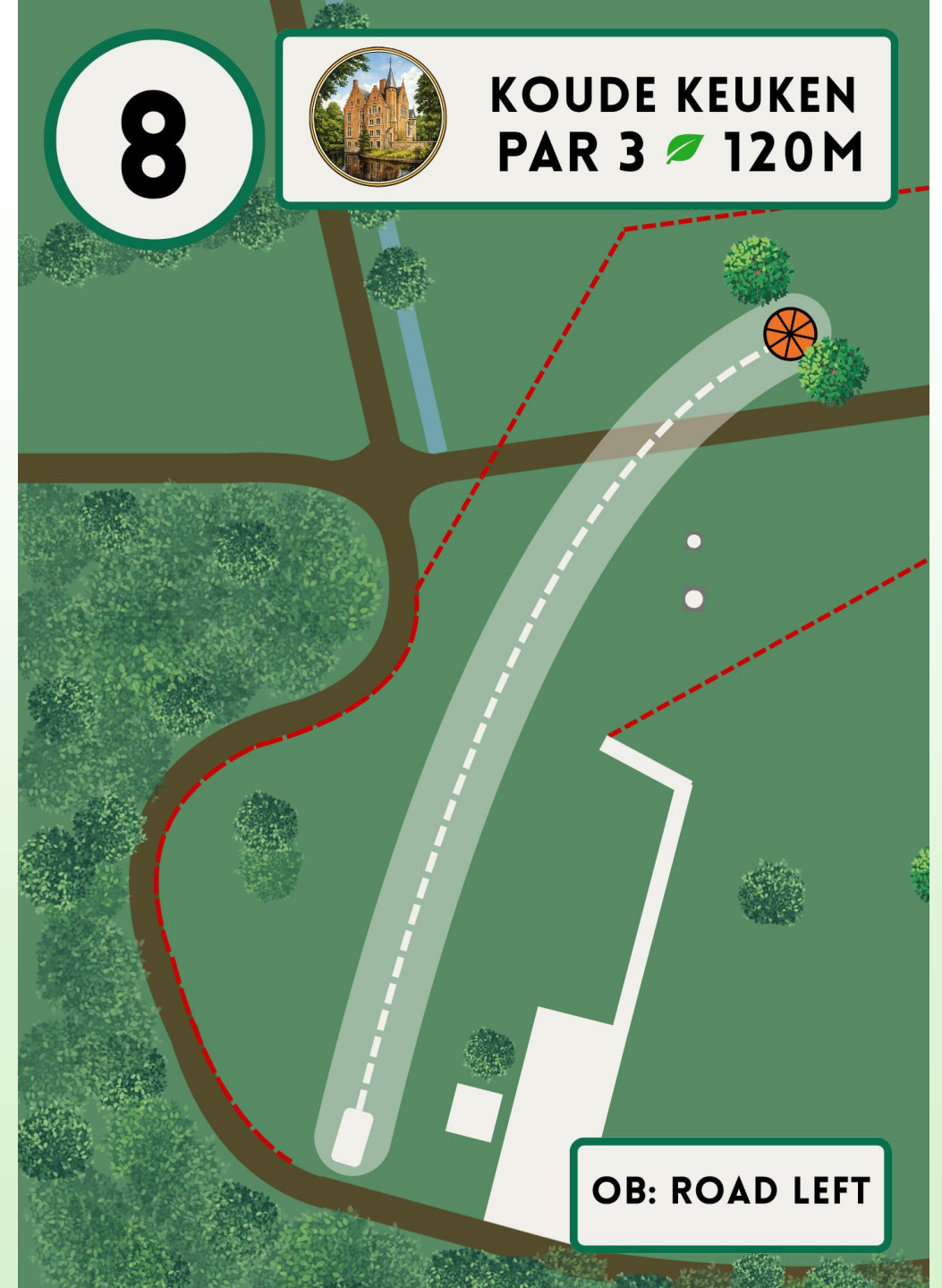
Path left OB

OB left splits off the path towards the green to separate fairway hole 9

Archery gallery on the right is OB

OB right from the gallery towards the water (not in play)

Path crossing the fairway (inside the OB lines) is not OB



Hole 9

Water in the moat is OB

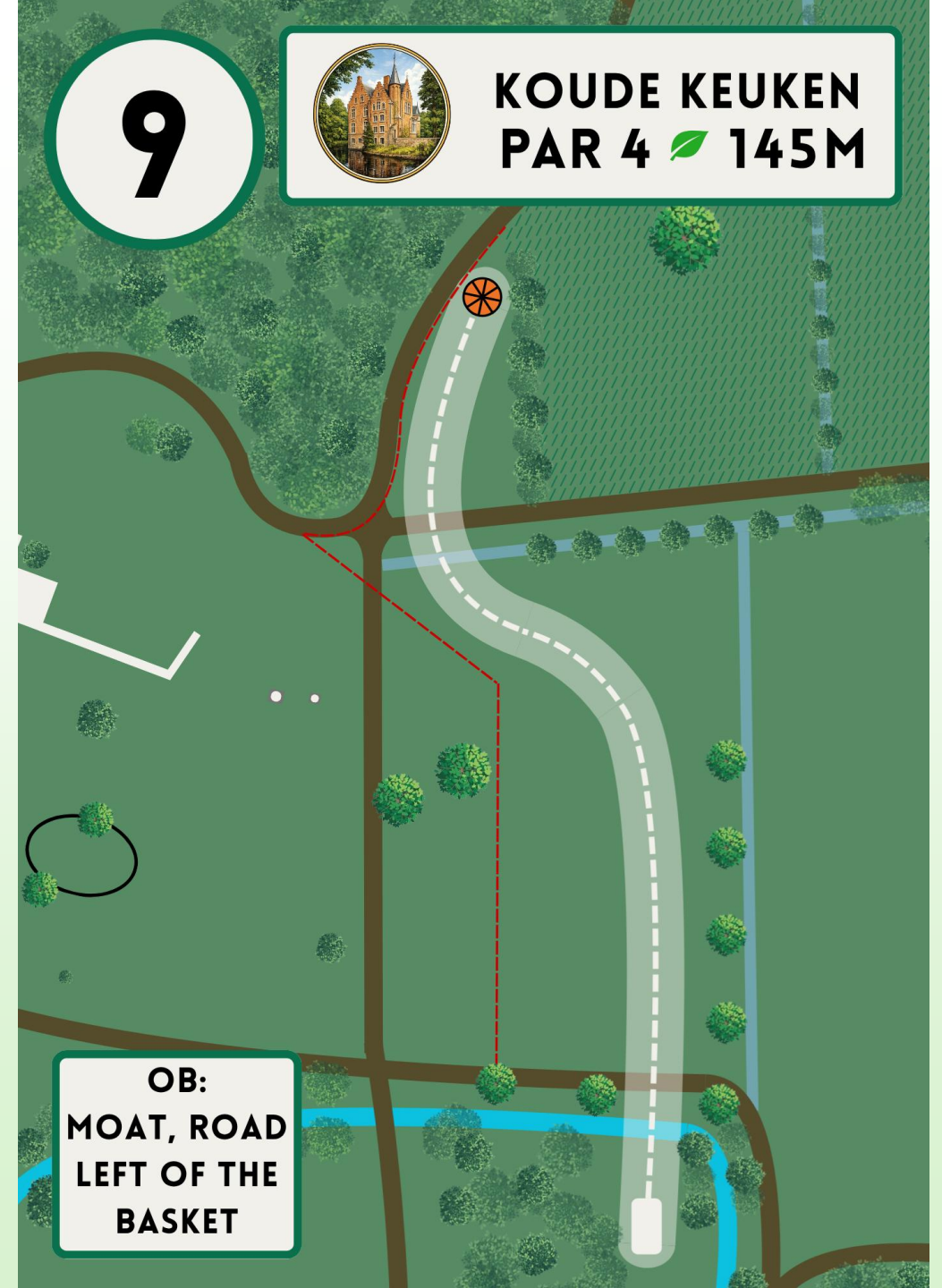
Dry ditches further up the fairway are not OB

OB along the left side separating fairway hole 8

Path on the left of the green is OB

Path crossing the fairway is not OB

High grass right of the basket is not OB (but a very bad place to be)



Hole 10

Water in the left ditch is OB

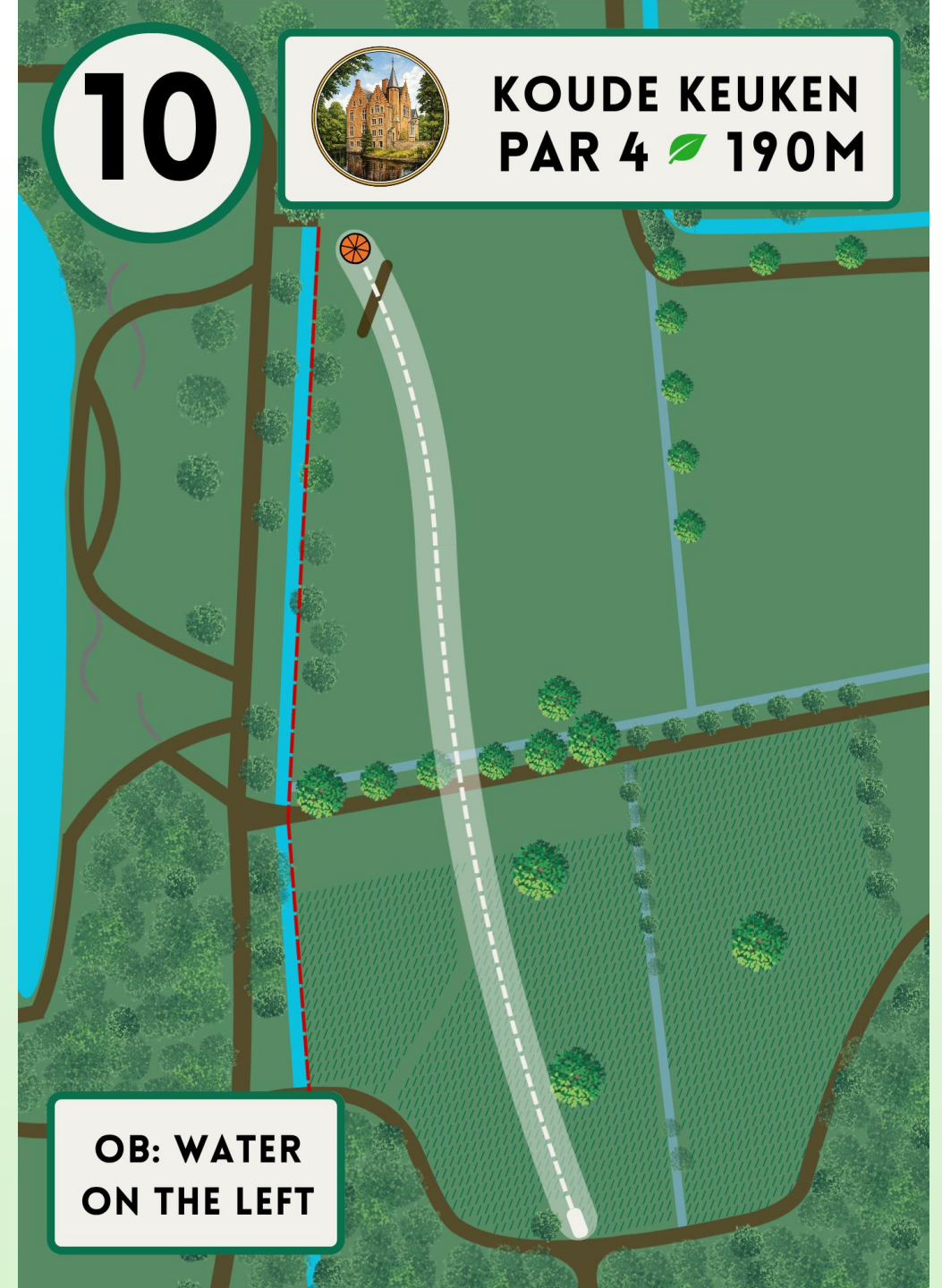
Dry ditch and path crossing the fairway are not OB

High grass short off the tee is not OB (but an even worse place to be)

Follow the mown paths through the high grass to get to your lie

Cart-friendly access to green and fairway beyond the ditch is just behind the basket. Follow the path on the left

The basket before the ditch on the very right side of the fairway is not in play. That is the permanent course short pin.



Hole 11

All paths OB except the one crossing the green

Water OB

If you somehow never crossed the path in front of the tee:
re-tee

CTP round 3!



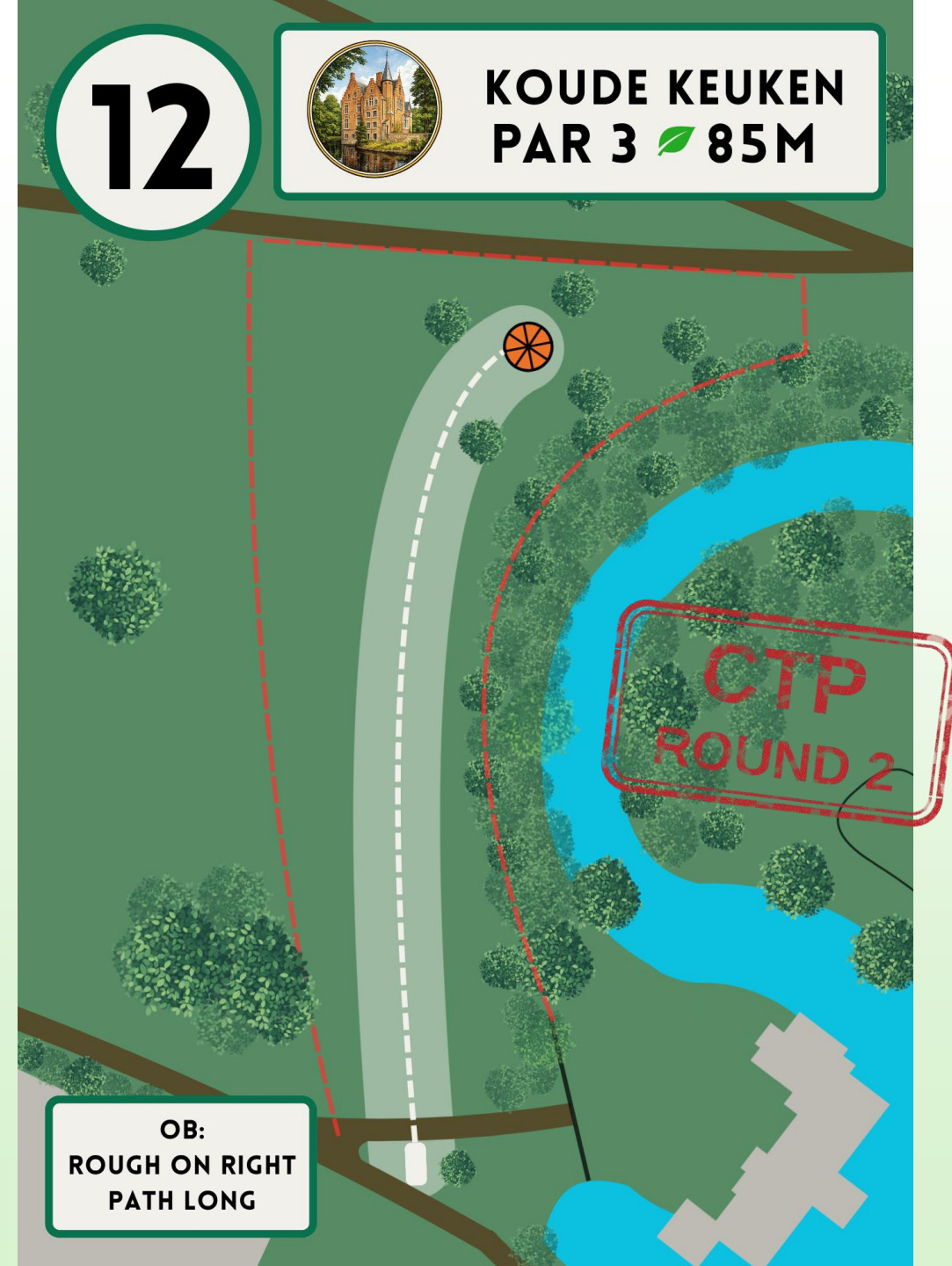
Hole 12

Path long is OB

Rough on the right is OB (you don't want to be there)

OB on the left separates hole 12

CTP Round 2!



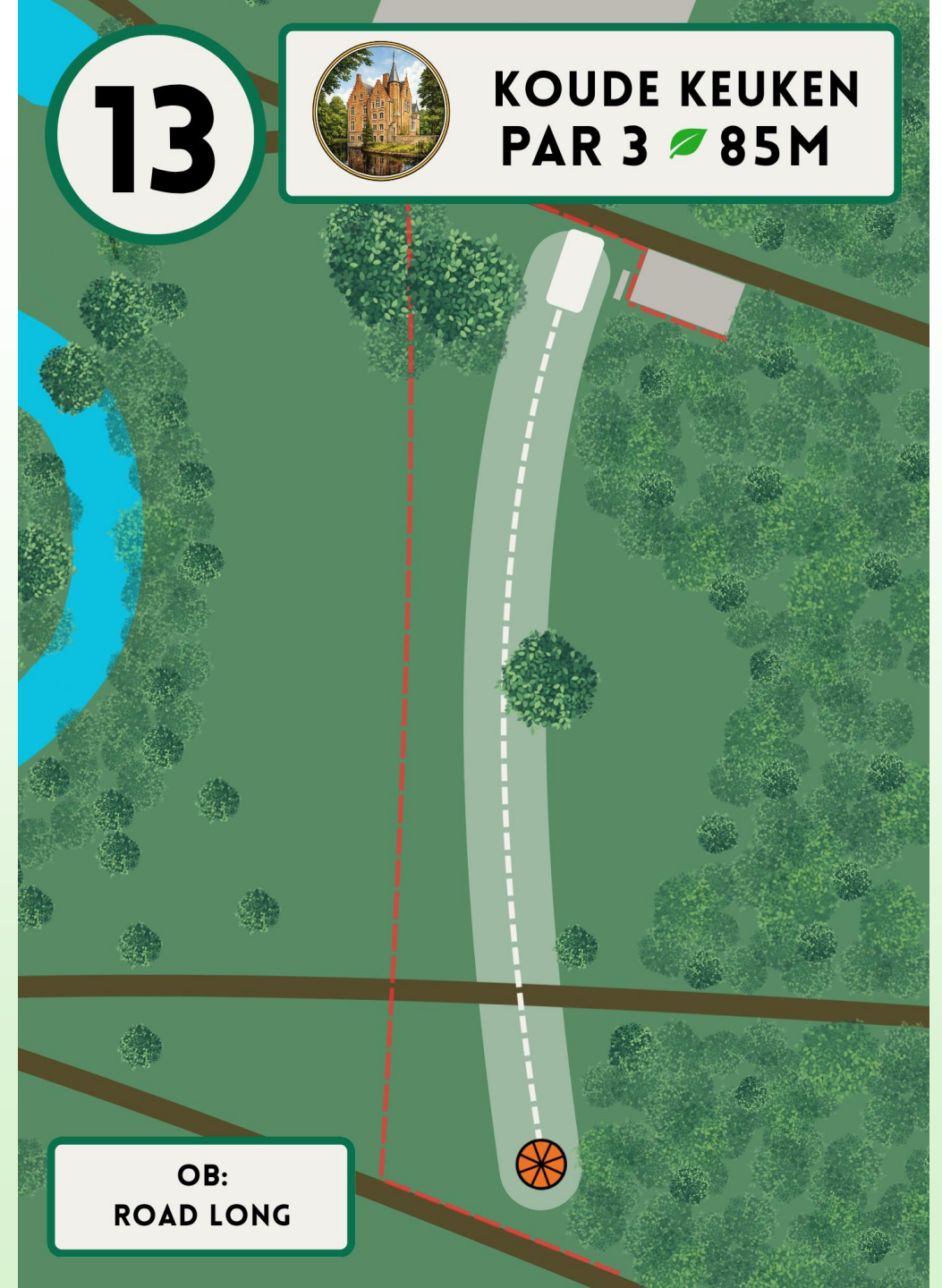
Hole 13

Road long is OB

Rough on the left is not OB

OB on the right separates hole 12

Path crossing the fairway is not OB



Disc Golf in Bruges

This is not the first course in Brugge, not even in domein Koude Keuken! In the 80's, a full 18-hole wooden pole target course was installed here, but with park renovations in the mid-90's the course disappeared. Since then, Bruges' Ultimate club FreezzzBeezzz has steadily grown into a European top club and one of the largest clubs in Belgium. Disc sports are hot in Bruges. It is the ideal place for a grassroots disc golf program.

This course has been developed in close collaboration with Stad Brugge and FreezzzBeezzz and we are determined to bring this sport back to Bruges, and this time to stay! However, the future of disc golf in de Koude Keuken is all but guaranteed. This summer lay-out is a test case. On the one hand to see if the course attracts (new) players from in and outside Bruges, but also to gauge the park's saturation and safety.

It is therefore up to us, discgolfers, to showcase who we are. To show up, but remain within the spirit of the sport: Respect the course, respect the park users and help other disc golfers to do the same. Together we can grow the sport and open up these new fairways in the West!

The NT is heavily promoted through city socials, so we can expect some public to show up. Please help us out in guiding people who probably have no prior knowledge of how a disc golf gallery behaves. Show them where to stand and how to respect player focus.
