BASIC RULES 4 NC

- One tournament in each country per season.
- The 4NC can be embedded in an existing tournament.
- Minimum 16 spots reserved for 4NC players.
- All players can play, that are somehow related to a participating club.
- A player must have played at least two rounds to gain points for the team.

POINT SYSTEM 4 NC

- The four best scores per team are summed up. The best team score will get 100/75/50/25 points.
- Podium places in each offered division will be awarded with 30/20/10 points to the teams.
- Solo Competition: There will be an overall ranking for all offered divisions.
- For each event the seven best 4NC players will be awarded with 10/7/5/4/3/2/1 points.

- Create a spectacular and international Disc Golf event in our home town.
- Get new people to play and love our sport.
- Attract more women and kids for our sport.
- Get more publicity and PR in our regions.
- Building up Disc Golf networks across borders.

INTRODUCTION

The Storkhyzers are excited to welcome you to this tournament, the 1st leg of the 4 nations cup.

The 4 Nations Cup is sponsored by the PDGA, and this local tournament is sponsored by the Strasbourg University Club and Crédit Mutuel.

With your inscription, each player will receive a players pack including some disc golf goodies and tournament-day snacks.

Our divisions this year are ratings-based* :

- Purple for PDGA ratings under 800
- Red for PDGA ratings from 800 to 899
- Blue for PDGA ratings from 900 to 969

And we have 2 pro open categories, one for men and one for women.

- FPO
- MPO

Please try to join the applicable rating category. If you do not have an active PDGA rating, join whichever category most aligns with your level. Juniors and women can also join ratings divisions (or FPO for ladies, if preferred).

*4 Nations Cup bonuses will still be awarded for traditional divisions of men, women, junior, and masters.



COURSE

The course this year features some new holes and new challenges! We will play an 18-hole layout with 9 baskets, once in the morning and once in the afternoon. Please note the OB that will come into play on every hole, and the hazard area on holes 5/14.

Any disc which comes to rest inside or on top of the kiosk between holes 4/13 and 5/14 will be OB.

On holes 6-9 and 15-18, the athletic running track comes into play. Please note that the running track will always play OB, and for a disc on the track to be in play, it must be angled up over the track border, thus touching a safe area in play. Other OB will be clearly marked with flags. On holes 7 and 16, any disc which crosses the running track but does not land in the safe zone around the basket will be OB, played from wherever it last crossed into the OB area. The northeast corner of the football field is OB for hole 7, but safe for holes 9 and 18. The hole 7 tee/fairway football field is considered OB for holes 6 and 15.

There is a Double Mando passage on holes 3 and 12. The 2 largest trees at about the halfway point of the hole form the Double Mando. A disc which passes to the right of the right tree or left of the left tree is considered as « missing the mando » and will then be played from the indicated drop zone between the two trees with one penalty point.

On holes 5 and 14, any disc which comes to rest within the marked hazard zone will be played from where it lies, with one additional penalty point added to the score.

AWARDS

If you choose to participate in the CTP challenge, the cash payout will be on hole 16 (2 chances to win).

A disc reward CTP will be on holes 5/14 (4 chances to win).

If no one wins the ACE payout, we will have a CTP throw-off after round 2 for half of the Ace pot (the other half will go to the club).

Trophies and discs will be awarded to winners in each division.

All players must keep score during PDGA rounds.




