Welcome to the Belgian Championship 2025, hosted in the beautiful setting of Park Zandbergen! We're thrilled to have you join us for what promises to be an exciting and competitive day of disc golf.

While we warmly welcome all competitors, please note that this tournament serves as the official Belgian National Championship. As such, only Belgianbased players will be eligible for podium positions, trophies, and the official title of Belgian Champion.

Over the course of two rounds, you'll be playing Park Zandbergen on the White Layout.

Scoring will be handled through PDGA Live (https://www.pdga.com/score) using the event code **BK2025**. As per standard PDGA rules, at least two players in each group are required to keep score to ensure accuracy.

All rankings and round ratings will be published through PDGA as usual.

We look forward to a weekend filled with sportsmanship, strong drives, and great spirit. Thank you for being part of this special event, let the championship begin!

Schedule for the day

Hole 1 – Double Mando

This hole features a Double Mandatory between two marked trees. All throws must pass between the mando trees.

- If the mando is missed, proceed directly to the Drop Zone located between the mando trees.
- Add one penalty stroke to your score.





Hole 2 – Standard Play **!! ROUND 2 CTP Hole !!**

No mandatory, no OB. Play it straight and clean.

Hole 3 – Standard Play

No mandatory, no OB. Pay attention to people coming down the path.





Hole 5 - OB Long, Pond Behind the Basket

- The pond long of the basket is Out of Bounds.
- The OB line is clearly marked with flags.
- If your disc lands in the pond beyond the flagged OB line, proceed with a one-stroke penalty and play your next shot from the last point in bounds (normal ob rules).

Casual Water - Blue Area in Front of the Basket

- The blue area in front of the basket is a small, shallow depression that may occasionally contain water. If there is water present and your disc lands in it, it is considered Casual Water.
- In that case, you may take free relief and play your next shot from behind the water, on the side closest to the tee pad, keeping the basket and your disc in line. If the area is dry, simply play your lie as it is.





Hole 6 - OB Long, Slope Behind the Basket

- The area down the slope behind the basket is Out of Bounds.
- The OB line is clearly marked with flags.
- If your disc crosses this line and comes to rest OB, play your next shot from the last point in bounds with a one-stroke penalty.

Safety Notice – Crossing Players

- Please be aware of players crossing the fairway from right to left coming from Hole 7.
- Always check if the fairway is clear before throwing. Safety first!

Hole 7 - Island Green!

This hole features an Island Green – your disc must come to rest within the marked island area to be considered in bounds.

- If you miss the island, proceed to the Drop Zone for your next throw.
- A one-stroke penalty will be added to your score.





Hole 8 - Standard Play, No OB

This hole has no special rules or OB

Safety Reminder

- Keep an eye out for players approaching from behind the corner.
- Also be aware of players walking from Hole 11 to Hole 12, who may cross or pass near the fairway.
- Always make sure the area is clear before throwing. Safety comes first!

Hole 9 - Standard Play, No Special OB

This hole has no special OB

Safety Reminder

- The tee for Hole 10 is located on the left side.
- This hole also crosses fairways with Hole 11, so caution is essential.
- A spotter will guide play using a flag system:
 - Green flag: You're clear to throw.
 - Red flag: Hold your throw wait until it's safe.
- Always check with the spotter before playing your shot. Safety first, smooth flow for all!



Hole 10 – OB rough left

Out of Bounds (OB):

- The left side is OB if the disc lands in the thick rough beyond the flagged line.
- The pond on the left, located behind the fence, is also OB.

Special Rule – Fence Area:

- If your disc lands within the fence wall, you are granted casual relief.
- Proceed without penalty, placing your lie one meter back, in line with the basket.

Safety & Spotting:

- Be aware of players on or returning from the green.
- Always check the spotter's signal before throwing.



Hole 11 – Mando left and right

There is a mandatory (mando) tree on the left and right.

Your disc must pass between them. If you miss one of the mando's, proceed to the drop zone for your next shot and take a one-stroke penalty.

This hole crosses fairways with Hole 9. Always check with the spotter before throwing. Be cautious of players teeing off at Hole 10.





Hole 13 – Don't go long

No special OB rules but it's not advised to go long as it slopes down and is pretty rough back there.

Watch out for other players/people coming from behind the corner, crossing fairways with hole 14.



Hole 14 – rough left

No special OB rules

Watch out for other players/people coming from behind the corner or still playing the hole, crossing fairways with hole 13.







Hole 16 – OB long !! Round 1 CTP Hole !!

OB long behind the flags over the small branch wall behind the basket. OB far left (fairway 17) and OB right down the slope passed the flagged line.

Hole 17 – ob right behind the branch wall

OB right behind the wall (marked with flags) OB left over the top of the slope on the fairway of hole 4 (OB line hole 4/17)



Hole 18 – OB behind the basket

OB long on and down the slope behind the basket, normal OB rules apply.

Watch out for other players/people at HQ behind the corner or still playing the hole.
