Discussion

Only the player's assigned caddie may walk with the group and must wear the player's provided caddie bib. All other attendees are "spectators" and must remain within the assigned Spectator Areas.

All players are required to check-in for the event at least two hours before your Thursday tee time. Event Check-In is located within the Banquet Room. Any player who does not check in shall forfeit their official place and entry fee.

All players must check in with their Course Starter no less than 5 minutes prior to their tee time each day and be present at the starting hole for the 5 minutes preceding their tee time. Players who do not check in with the starter by this time or who are not present at the starting hole for the 5 minutes preceding their tee time receive a two-throw penalty.

All players and their assigned caddie are expected to dress appropriately and to maintain a clean and well-groomed appearance. CM 4.04 is being enforced for players and caddies. A waiver is not necessary from the PDGA since Wildhorse is a private facility.

Each player must keep an independent scorecard recording scores after each hole for the entire group. A player who refuses to keep score will be disqualified. Players may delegate scorekeeping duties only to their designated caddie.

The designated smoking areas for all individuals present include parking lots, streets and service roads, outside balconies, and within 30 feet of any restroom or port-a-potty. Pace of play rules still apply.

All competitors shall play without undue delay and make every effort to keep up with the group in front of them. Undue delay means delays in play that affect the pace of play of the group behind them. The rules permit you to check for wind, use rangefinders, change discs, discuss options with your caddie, etc. – but within 30 seconds. The 30 seconds starts when a reasonable amount of time is given to arrive at and determine the lie, and the playing area remains dear. Loud or annoying noises do not reset the 30-second dock. A player causing undue delays should be issued an excessive time violation. Players are expected to promptly call a violation when one has dearly occurred. If a group causes undue delay or refuses to enforce rules is a courtesy violation and may be issued a tournament warning for overt failure or refusal to enforce rules.
