Schedule of Events

Friday, June 6

- 9:00am-4:00pm: Early check-in at the Lift House. Check-in is required for all players to confirm arrival, receive their player's pack, and get their lift ticket for the Scenic Summer Chairlift to access the course.
- 9:00am-5:00pm: Platinum Chair is open to access the course for practice rounds. **Last chair down from the Summit is at 5:30pm. If you miss last chair, hiking down is the only option to get down from the Summit.**
- 5:00pm: In place of a meeting, all tournament information will be emailed. Tee time assignments will be available via the PDGA official results page for the tournament and via the Digital Scorecard.
- 8:30pm-10:00pm: Pop-Up Course Flex Start Glow Round at Brandenburg Park hosted by Noodle Arm Nation.

Saturday, June 7

- 7:00am-12:00pm: Day of check-in at the Lift House. Check-in is required for all players to confirm arrival, receive their player's pack, and get their lift ticket for the Scenic Summer Chairlift to access the course.
- 8:10am: First round tee times start.
- 5:00pm: Player's Party at the Grill at the Lift House. Food, drinks, raffle, and games. Vending from Noodle Arm Nation and Good Buddies by Design. Prizes for the winners of the Flex Start Glow Round.

Sunday, June 8

- 8:00am: Begin loading the chairlift.
- 9:00am: Second round shotgun start.
- 2:00pm-4:00pm: Awards at the Grill at the Lift House as players unload the chairlift.

Notable PDGA Rules

- The two-meter rule, 805.02 Disc Above Two Meters, will **not** be in effect for the tournament.
- There is no out-of-bounds on the course.
- In the event of ties, 1.09 Ties, players will play sudden-death on holes 8, 9, and 10, then repeat if necessary. Sudden-death play is a format where the player or players with the lowest score on a hole move on to the next hole, and all other players are eliminated. When only one player has the lowest score on a hole, that player has won the tiebreaker, and sudden-death play is over. The Official Rules of Disc Golf and the Competition Manual apply during sudden-death play, but the throws do not accrue to the players' scores or break ties for any position other than first. **Ties only need to be broken for first place in any division.**
- 808 Scoring
 - A. Each player must keep an independent scorecard recording scores after each hole for the entire group. A player who refuses to keep score will be disqualified.
 - F. All players are responsible for reconciling and submitting their copy of the scorecard within 30 minutes of when their group finishes their round. A player who has not submitted their scorecard on time receives two penalty throws.
- 805.03 Lost Disc
 - A. A disc is declared lost if the player cannot locate it within three minutes after having arrived at the area where it is thought to be. Any player in the group or an Official may begin the timing of the three minutes and must inform the group that the timing has begun.
 - B. All players in the group must assist in searching for the disc. Failure to do so is a courtesy violation.
 - C. Once a disc has been declared lost, the status does not change if subsequently found. A player is allowed to use the disc if found.
 - D. A player whose disc has been declared lost receives one penalty throw. The next throw is made from the previous lie. If a drop zone has been designated for lost discs on the hole, the player may throw from the drop zone instead of from the previous lie.
- 3.03 Player Misconduct
 - C. The following actions also violate the above standard. Players who commit one or more of these violations will not receive a warning, and will be immediately disqualified by the Tournament Director:
 - 4. Public display or use of alcohol at PDGA events sanctioned at C-Tier or higher, or of cannabis at PDGA events sanctioned at any Tier level, even where otherwise lawful or permitted, from the two-minute signal to the time the player's scorecard is submitted.
- In the event of weather that necessitates suspending play, I will notify everyone via three airhorn blasts and the messaging feature through PDGA live scoring. We maintain a lightning perimeter for summer operations and will follow our policy. If cloud-to-ground lightning is visible or detected via our radar within our perimeter, we will suspend the chairlift for 20 minutes and tournament play for 30 minutes. For any subsequent strikes, the timer resets. More information about the PDGA policy is linked below.

Course Notes

- MPO, FPO, MP40, MP50, and MA1 play from the Pro Tees. FA1, MA40, FA40, MA50, FA50, MA2, FA2, MA3, and FA3 play from the Amateur Tees.
- Hole 15 Pro Tee: Am Tee is the designated drop zone if a disc thrown on the player's drive is declared lost per PDGA 805.03 Lost Disc. All other lies will be subsequently played according to PDGA standards.
- Hole 17 Pro Tee: Am Tee is the designated drop zone if a disc thrown on the player's drive is declared lost per PDGA 805.03 Lost Disc. All other lies will be subsequently played according to PDGA standards.
- The CTP for Saturday will be on Hole 13C, and the CTP for Sunday will be on Hole 9. Please use the white side of the tape to measure it. Text me your full name and the measurement in inches at 215-272-8117. There will be a marking flag to show the current CTP. Please only move the flag if you overtake the CTP. CTP is based on your first throw only. **There is only one CTP for all divisions per day.**
- Drinking water is available at the Tip Restaurant, Tee 5, and Tee 14.
- Restrooms are available at the Tip Restaurant.

Payouts & Trophies

Pro payouts will be completed via PayPal following the tournament. Amateur payouts will be completed via email with a gift card valid at Noodle Arm Nation. This gift card can be used upon tournament completion at the Noodle Arm Nation tent or the brick-and-mortar store in Ruidoso, New Mexico. <https://noodlearmnation.com/>

First-place players in all divisions will receive a trophy for their division.

- Tee times and groupings will be posted on Friday at approximately 5:00pm.

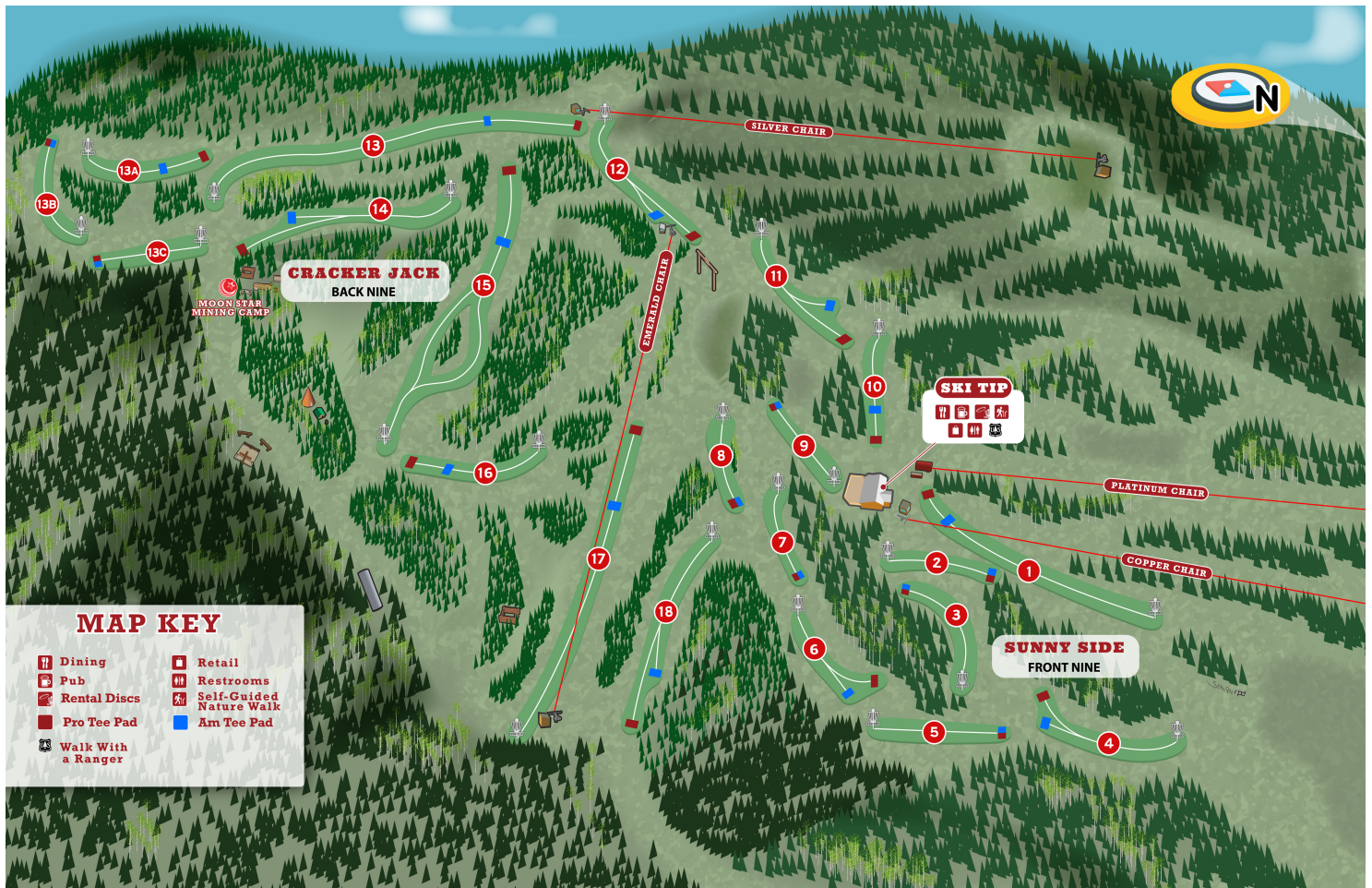
Sunday Shotgun Start

- Shotgun start hole assignments will be available on Saturday night via the PDGA official results page for the tournament and the Digital Scorecard.
- The chairlift will open at 8:00am to begin loading. Please be on time. Tournament staff will be checking in with players at the Summit to communicate any changes to hole assignments or other relevant information.
- The two-minute signal will be via two airhorn blasts. The two-minute signal is a notification to all players that practice has ceased and that all PDGA rules and regulations are in force, and that the Tournament Director intends to begin play in two minutes.
- The start signal will be given by a single, prolonged airhorn blast.
